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

FICCI-JKLU Virtual Roundtable on 'A Road Map for Universal Health Care'

he COVID pandemic starkly highlighted the inadequacy of government healthcare capacities, especially the availability of hospital beds, in the country& the wide disparity among states. In this context, on January 21, 2022The Centre for Policy Studies, an independent thinktank at JK Lakshmipat University, along with FICCI, organised a Virtual Healthcare Roundtable to discuss the recommendations contained in the policy paper by Mr Ajay Shankar titled 'A Road Map for Universal Health Care'. Mr Ajay Shankar, the Chairperson and Distinguished Fellow of the Centre for Policy Studies, JKLU, presented the paper before a panel chaired by Dr Sangita Reddy, Joint MD, Apollo Hospitals Group and Former President FICCI. The panelists included Dr Brijendra Kumar Rao, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital; Mr Sanjay Mitra, Former Chief Secretary, West Bengal; Dr Santosh Mehrotra, Visiting Professor at University of Bath, and Dr Harsh Mahajan, Co-Chair, FICCI Health Services Committee.

Four themes from the paper viz. Hospital Development, Full Holistic Free Public Health Care, Modernization/Digital Health Technology, & Reforming Private Health Care and Insurance were presented and discussed by the panel. Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, Past President, FICCI, Vice Chairman and MD, JK Paper & Member Board of Management at JK Lakshmipat University provided the welcome remarks and added to the summary statements by the Chair. The speakers highlighted the need to focus on accessible healthcare as quintessential for nation building& development, and the role of collaboration between the government and corporations in attaining set healthcare goals for the welfare of citizens.

International Conference on "Sustainable Future: Innovations in Education"

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K Lakshmipat University, in collaboration with St. Cloud State University, USA and AIC-JKLU organized the tenth edition of its two-day International Conference on UN's SDGs on February 25-26, 2022. This year, the theme was, "Sustainable Future: Innovations in Education", which was attended by more than 1000 viewers and had 22 speakers across the globe. It received conference received over 70 research submissions out of which 48 promising works were presented. Shri Anil Kakodkar, Padma Vibhushan and Nuclear Scientist: Prof Sudhir Jain, Padmashri and Vice-Chancellor, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi; Dr Pramath Raj Sinha, Founding Dean, ISB Hyderabad and Prof. Ajit Chaturvedi, Director IIT Roorkeewere some of the dignitaries who graced the conference. The conference was co-sponsored by BSE, Institution's Innovation Council and Turnitin and had IIT Roorkee, IIT Gandhinagar, IIT Jammu, IIT Bhilai, MNIT Jaipur and Central University of Rajasthan as JKLU's Academic Partners. It brought all the stakeholders on one platform and collectively discussed different aspects of education focusing on achieving a sustainable future.

On its Opening Day, the event had keynote and technical sessions, paper presentations and panel discussions on 'Education for Creating Better World', 'Tools for Teaching and Learning Effectiveness', 'Educational Practices for Special Needs' and 'Educational Policy and Governance'. During the session on Special Needs, Prof VladanDevedzic, Professor at FON – School of Business Administration,


University of Belgrade, Serbia stressed on how we all are learners with special needs when it comes to artificial intelligence and other modern technologies. Dr Doris Santos, Associate Professor at National University of Colombia, Bogotá, Colombia, who spoke about educational policy and governance, highlighted on the need of cocreation of knowledge through collective action by community actors and academics on issues related to SDGs. The second day started with a keynote session by Dr SiddhartanGovindasamy, Professor at Boston College, USA and Prof Ben Baliga, Professor at St Cloud State University, USA. The speakers shared their views on 'Future Trends in Engineering Education' and discussed how human-centred education and automation is changing the future of education. The keynote session was followed by multiple sessions which focused on the 'role of Ed-tech in education' and presentations from emerging Ed-tech start-ups, which were evaluated by Mr MrinalKashyap, VP Sales, WhiteHat Jr. There was a panel discussion on 'Models for Financing Education' and a session on how the future of education is being shaped by learnings from past and Covid-19. Prof Dheeraj Sanghi, Chairman of Conference Steering Committee & Vice-Chancellor, JKLU said, "The two-day conference has given a broad vision from the modern technologies to blended learning and how it is helping the education industry, and this international conference will be the stepping stone in the students' lives and become the future of tomorrow."





Academic Forum Session on "Igniting the Joy of Engineering: IoT and Automation Projects"





session titled 'Igniting the Joy of Engineering: IoT and Automation Projects', sixth in series on Igniting the Joy of Engineering, planned by IQAC to share the methods utilized by faculties of the Institute of Engineering and Technology in their courses, was scheduled on January 20, 2021. Speakers of the session were Divanshu Jain, Gustavo Sanchez, HP Agarwal and Devika Kataria. The course Introduction to Internet of Things delivered to students of B.Tech. aims to develop understanding of fundamental concepts and develop skills for uploading data from sensors on a web server for analysis or to actuate some transducers. This course is followed by Automation projects where students work in teams and develop projects to develop various automation applications. The Industrial IoT elective course aims to imbibe competencies required to design, implement, and maintain IoT systems at the industrial level: for example, interfacing Programmable Logic Controller, sensors, drive and motor, controlling them locally or remotely. In this session, speakers shared the experiences of these courses. The session was co-ordinated by Dr Sonal Jain and Dr Umesh Gupta.

IEEE Webinar on Ethical Hacking



webinar coordinated by the IEEE students branch was held on "Ethical Hacking" on January 22, 2022. Mr Sandeep Sengupta, lead auditor for Information Security was invited as an Expert for the session, which was attended by 45 students. The expert spoke on cyber safety while using browsers for password login and the use of social media sites. He spoke about vulnerability assessment and penetration testing using tools Nmap, Kali Linux, Metasploit, and SQLmap. 

National Science Day





K Lakshmipat University organized an activity-packed event on the theme 'Integrated approach in Science and Technology for a Sustainable Future' to celebrate National Science Day, which takes place every year on February 28, 2022 to mark the discovery of the Raman Effect by renowned Indian physicist and Nobel Laureate Sir C. V. Raman. Prof Dheeraj Sanghi, Vice Chancellor, JKLU addressed the gathering and urged the audience to develop a scientific temper to make everyone's life easy. He also mentioned about many big incidences, or coincidences related to scientific community on 28th February. Prof Geeta Bhatt, Director, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board, University of Delhi delivered the Keynote lecture on the topic 'Leading towards an inclusive future - with Science and Technology'. She analysed the contribution of Sir CV Raman towards the scientific community as well as the contribution of science and technology in developing an inclusive community. Apart from students' developing a scientific temperament, she emphasized on roles of connectivity and sharing of information to increase inclusivity at all levels. Mr Jha stressed the importance ofcertain skills in successful project management, viz asking relevant questions, effective communication, negotiation skills, time management, leadership towards taking responsibility, technical knowledge, risk management, critical thinking and taking feedback from clients. He illustrated it by citing anecdotes from his personal success and failures how presence or absence of the mentioned skills determined the results. The session, which was followed by an interactive question and answer round, was attended by over 80 BBA and MBA students and faculty members. The session was coordinated and moderated by Dr. Upasana Singh, Assistant Professor, IM.

Expert Talk on Critical Information Instructure and Impact of Denial-of-Service Attack.

An interactive session was held on March 24, 2022, in which Dr Divya Bansal, Professor CSE, Punjab Engineering College spoke on evolution of



critical infrastructure and its role in providing reliable services, social interactions and data generation through social websites, TCP/IP layer concepts, Denial of Services Attacks and its impact. Session on

"Democracy
and The
Electoral
Process"

n the March 7, 2022 JKLU's Centre for Communication and Critical Thinking organized a session titled "Democracy and The Electoral Process" for all the students and faculty members across the University. The session's speaker was Mr Arpan Acharya, Assistant Professor of Law at Bennett University and Convenor of the Clinics Committee which manages all forms of clinical legal education other than moot courts and legal aid. Mr Acharya is currently engaged in writing research papers focusing on the judicial treatment of the right to religion in India, especially with regards to how the socio-political and judicial discourse on love jihad has incentivized the creation of a new form of (religiously) hierarchized citizenship, and looking at the application of the state action doctrine to large social media platforms and their constitutional liability. The session was organised in hybrid mode. The speaker contextualized the theme of the session against his knowledge and various historical events. He explained how, while democracy is often discussed as being a part of our constitutional commitment, in practice, there are many ills that plague the electoral process. He used the INDIA VOTE website to demonstrate some statistical data of various elections in India. The speaker, however, was focused on something more fundamental; the way we conceive of electoral democracy and the conflation of representation with the first past the post system and common electorates. He tapped on the Indian political history common electorates which have often been held up as the epitome of equality and fairness. He also brought the audience focus on the proportional representation which is used by Europeans for elections. The speaker openly discussed some of Ambedkar's thoughts on electoral democracy and the question of representation, he shredded light on the constitutional

Ms Nidhi shared the success story of "Khatabook" and "Credo" which gained strong presence in market due to well implemented digital marketing plans. 85 students from different programs of the university participated. Students asked varied questions reflecting their interest and curiosity to delve deeper in the topic and explore its different aspects. The session was coordinated and moderated by Dr. Upasana Singh, Assistant Professor, IM.

Leadership Workshop Series on Gender and Masculinities in Relationship

KLU's Center for Communication and Critical Thinking, in collaboration with The YP Foundation, organised the first session of Leadership Workshop series on 'Gender and Masculinities in Relationship' on March 11, 2022. Sagar and Siddhant were the two facilitators from the YP foundation who conducted the workshop. It was intended for the Students' Council and Club presidents to engage them with holistic leadership development. The workshop was initiated with a warm-up activity and students were instructed to put down their rules throughout the session. Further, based on the predefined rules of the students, facilitators initiated their workshop underlining the

important aspects of the masculinities and the role of consent within the relationship. They screened stories to clarify the concept and discussed its day-to-day applications. Student participants actively engaged in the conversation and expressed their



understanding of the relationship and consent. The facilitators conducted the exercise that highlighted the pre-conceived notions of Masculinity and Femininity. They also utilized various exercises to debunk society's stereotypical preconceived notions and how it is dangerous to remain within those rigidly defined spectrums of femininity and masculinity. They further initiated the debate of identity beyond the defined binary of society. The discussion on LGBTQIA identity and its varied spectrum opened up the space for discussion among the students. They have also highlighted different forms of violence within relationships through the context of masculinity. The students actively engaged in discussing gender identity and reflected a broad-minded approach by questioning the existing patriarchy, identity imposition, form of violence, and discrimination among identities. There were 23 Student Council and Club president members and CCCT faculty members. The workshop was conducted offline, along with an interactive outdoor activity.

Distinguished Lecture on Data Science for Social Good

The speaker was Shri Bezwada Wilson, an activist and National Convenor of the SafaiKaramchariAndolan which campaigns for the eradication of manual scavenging. He has been honoured with the Ramon Magsaysay Award and is a Senior Ashoka Fellow. The session was organised in a hybrid mode, with IM Amphitheatre being the physical venue. Over a hundred participants attended the session which included the faculty, students, staff & members of the public. Shri Wilson contextualised the theme of the session against his background and life experiences. He explained the need for social reservation while locating them against Fundamental Rights guaranteed by the Indian Constitution. He highlighted the need to encourage discussions and debate on issues of equality and justice while mentioning the role of freedom fighters and progressive thinkers like BR Ambedkar in eradicating the social evil of caste discrimination. He proposed that contemporary aspirations of citizens should be towards an egalitarian social order. This should be reflected in creation of public policies and technological innovations with a sunset clause for timely delivery of such goals. Students were encouraged to internalise notions of empathy and fraternity in their endeavours as participants of a democratic society. The evils of manual scavenging were discussed, as was the need to end such a socially debilitating practice.

The student interviewers learnt what it feels to be on the other side of the table and the observers learnt the different behavioural characteristics of the two sides in an evaluation situation. Both interviewer and interviewee learnt about their strengths and limitations from a peer group, which was deliberately planned to make the experience more relatable.

BCA student Kartavya Anadkatcontinued to bring laurels through his brilliant performance in international chess tournaments and was featured on Jamaican TV. He achieved



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
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
